- 5. How I intend to run council meetings differently
  - a. Proponents first
  - Plenty of time for us to discuss the issue among ourselves in open session
    To probe for objections and concerns.
  - c. Don't expect unanimity on everything, but respectful of each other's position
  - d. Hope to have consensus on my major priorities
- 6. My priorities:
  - a. Public safety
    - 1. Resolution to get first responder pay in line as 10th largest city in Texas
    - 2. Work on pay steps to get there in 2-4 years
    - 3. Give mandate to CM to find funding in our budget to do so
    - 4. Commitment to increasing our number of officers
    - 5. Look for non-property tax alternate sources to fund public safety increases
  - b. No new revenue rate this year
    - 1. Keep 3.17 % from last year
    - 2. Have CM find sources through caps first outside of public safety and streets/infrastructure, then cuts elsewhere, then reserves if necessary
    - 3. No new building initiatives for 2 years
  - c. Neighborhood development
    - 1. Parks first
    - 2. Changes to UCC to control HD Multiuse
  - d. Fix the Alcove issue (put together a committee of City/County people to solve it)
  - e. Look at alternatives to Impact Fees
  - f. Get a definite plan to move forward on Broadway and how to fund it
  - g. Find promoter for Fourth on Broadway/promote Lubbock's entertainment
  - h. Work closely with developers especially on West and North side developments
- 6. Can I count on your support on the first 2 or 3 priorities?
